MANAGING MACROECONOMIC IMBALANCES

International Conference

19 June 2012, Ljubljana, Hotel Slon

With increased public borrowing in tighter financial market conditions, medium-term fiscal consolidation has come to the forefront of the economic policy agenda in the EU and Slovenia. Developing effective measures to deal with labour market issues during the period of fiscal consolidation, and meeting the Europe 2020 strategy targets are thus becoming the main challenges of economic policy.

In cooperation with the European Commission, Representation in Slovenia, the Institute of Macroeconomic Analysis and Development will hold a one-day international conference that will provide participants with an opportunity to exchange their thoughts and ideas on these issues.

The conference is organised into two thematic sessions:

- (i) Possible paths to fiscal consolidation in tightening financial market conditions and the movements in the Slovenian financial system, with emphasis on the lending activity of banks and indebtedness of Slovenia's economy;
- (ii) Designing measures to promote employment, focussing on the needs of young people and the reduction of labour market segmentation.

The conference will be concluded with a round table.
